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2025 Annual Infectious Disease Report

Confirmed and probable cases of infectious diseases reported to the Alaska Section of Epidemiology (SOE) for 2025 are presented below; counts may differ from prior publications as new information becomes available. Cases are assigned to 2025 according to [MMWR week](#) convention. [Diseases and conditions mandated to be reported to SOE](#) are not listed in this table if no cases were reported during 2025. [Case definitions for nationally notifiable conditions](#) are available on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention’s (CDC) website. National reporting standards assign cases to the patient’s state of residence unless otherwise specified in the case definition. COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) lab reports are tracked in the [Respiratory Virus Snapshot](#).

‡All CPO cases were carbapenemase-producing carbapenem-resistant Enterobacterales. CPO infections are generally acquired in health care settings; some cases may have received care outside Alaska. Other multidrug-resistant organism (MDRO) categories reported by SOE in prior years will be addressed in greater detail in a future dedicated MDRO report, allowing for a more comprehensive discussion of pathogen-specific nuances.

§Pathogens are not known to be naturally present in Alaska.

¶Annual case counts include illnesses diagnosed in Alaska in patients for whom official residence was unknown at the time of report; therefore, regions may not sum to total.

**Total includes cases with initial diagnosis out-of-state that were newly reported to SOE due to receipt of care in Alaska in 2025.

‡‡Per case definition, all diagnoses are counted regardless of residency.

‡‡Syphilis counts include both infectious and non-infectious cases.
